Minister Pekcan underlined the fact that Turkey offers investors a wide range of incentives, particularly for innovation and technology-oriented investments in the specialized free zones (SFZs). "We plan to expand the SFZ model for other high-tech and high value-added industries in the future", Minister Pekcan said. "It was initially rolled out for the software and information technology sector. But now I invite investors to consider offshoring to Turkey's SFZs," the minister added.

Turkey's qualifications, including its competitive edge in logistics, young and qualified labor, robust manufacturing capabilities and highly developed infrastructure set her apart from other investment destinations, Minister Pekcan highlighted.

Exporters Started 2021 with a Record

Turkish Exporters Assembly (TiM) announced the January export figures. In January, Turkey's exports reached 15 billion 48 million dollars, an increase of 2.5 percent compared to the same month last year, despite the coronavirus pandemic, making it the highest January export figure in the history. In January, 17 sectors increased their exports compared to the same month of the previous year. Especially the sectors that performed the strongest were the Jewelry, Air Conditioning, and Fruit and Vegetable.

The OECD opened a regional centre focused on global relations in Istanbul, creating a dedicated base for deepening co-operation with partner countries and helping them with policy guidance and technical support to build more inclusive and prosperous societies. The new OECD Istanbul Centre will be instrumental to help countries lay the groundwork for a sustainable post-COVID-19 recovery.



Peer Review of the Turkish Shipbuilding Industry

Turkey has a shipbuilding tradition of over 600 years. Indeed, the first shipyard was established in 1390 during the Ottoman reign. Following the foundation of the Republic of Turkey in 1923, shipyards were given a special interest and underwent a process of modernisation.

In 2019, Turkey was the 11th largest global shipbuilding economy in terms of seagoing vessel completions which amounted to 268 578 compensated gross tonnes (CGT). Turkish shipyards have been producing a variety of vessel types over the last ten years, including fishing vessels, trawlers, tankers, tugs, cruise/passenger ferries, dry cargo ships, offshore service vessels, bulk carriers, fully cellular containers (FCC), gas carriers and roll-on/rolloff (Ro-Ro) vessels. The Turkish shipbuilding industry also produces LNG-powered, hybrid-powered and electric-powered vessels. Turkey is also a significant global actor in ship repair, ship maintenance and ship recycling.



Yacht building is another important production area of Turkish shipyards. In recent years, Turkey has shown big progress in building boats and yachts and Turkey has become one of the world's leading mega-yacht building countries.

Turkey to Use First Gas From Black Sea in Q1, 2023

Turkey will start using gas from the Sakarya Gas Field in the Black Sea in the first quarter of 2023, government sources told Anadolu Agency on Thursday.

Turkey's first national drillship Fatih discovered 405 billion cubic meters (bcm) of natural gas last year in the country's largest discovery ever in its history and the biggest offshore gas discovery worldwide in 2020 at the Tuna-1 well located about 170 kilometers off Turkey's Zonguldak coast. The Fatih drillship continued drilling appraisal wells in the region, the first of which was completed at the Turkali-1 last month. The drillship is currently working on the second well, the Turkali-2, at water depths of 3,050 meters, the sources said.

Fatih will drill 10 Turkali wells in the Sakarya gas field over the next two years, each at a diameter of 2 kilometers. Another of the three state-owned drillships, the Kanuni, will start work on well completion in the field by the end of March.
